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Preface

This book is a reworking of a manuscript originally prepared by Basima Abed. Together with a brief introduction and indices, it included transliterations, autographed copies and photographs of a group of texts that were confiscated from illicit excavators by the Iraqi Antiquity Authorities as part of a larger group of texts now housed in the Iraq Museum. The common element that ties these texts together is their identical archival and commercial context; they can be identified as certain components of the archive belonging to Šamaš-zēru-ibni, son of Ayyana^{ad}, an agricultural entrepreneur who was active in and around the Southern Babylonian city Šāṭer during the second half of the fifth century BCE. In addition to the 60 texts of the original manuscript, the book presents seven more texts that can plausibly be connected to the same archive. These texts were studied by Mu-hannad K. J. Al-Shammari within the framework of his dissertation at the University of Baghdad (2018). Johannes Hackl revised the original manuscript and, in particular, reworked the introduction. Furthermore, he added translations and compiled a catalog and prosopography.

0. The structure of this book

The present volume begins with an introduction, providing necessary background information on the extant Late Achaemenid texts from Šāṭer. This includes an overview of what is known about the city in general, a discussion of the protagonists of the archive reconstructed from these texts, and a section on abbreviations and conventions. As detailed in the introduction, these remarks are not intended to be exhaustive but serve as a preliminary summary of the Late Achaemenid record from Šāṭer.

The book is organized into two main parts. Part I (chapters 2 and 3, along with the appendix to chapter 3) presents a catalog and editions of 67 legal documents from Šamaš-zēru-ibni's archive in Šāṭer. Part II (chapter 4) provides a prosopography, including the person files compiled from the Šāṭer texts featured in this volume, as well as those published elsewhere (excluding those found in Abraham & Zilberg 2024). Reproductions of the texts in the form of photo collages as well as 57 autographed copies, prepared by Basima Abed for the original manuscript and digitally enhanced by Taichuan Tang for publication (see preface), are included in chapter 3 to enhance the usability of this book.

1. Introduction

1.1. General remarks

The 67 texts presented in this volume are part of a larger group of (Babylonian) Late Achaemenid legal documents from Šāṭer, a city that is believed to be located somewhere in the area northwest of Uruk up to the outskirts of Nippur.¹ The remaining components of this group which are available in published form fall into three sub-groups shaped by the vicissitudes of the antiquities trade in the early 20th and 21st centuries:² 7 texts housed in the Louvre and published in Joannès 1982 (“Louvre group,” Art I 35–Art II 2 = 430–403 BCE); 3 texts housed in the Vorderasiatisches Museum in Berlin and published in Hackl 2017 (“VAM group,” Art I [9]–25 = 455–439 BCE); and 28 texts held in a private collection in Jerusalem and published in Abraham & Zilberg 2022 and 2024 (“Jerusalem group,” Art I 12–36 = 453–429 BCE). To these can be added a fourth group, consisting of some 140 texts that, like the texts presented here (“IM group A,” Xer [x]–Art I 21 = c. 486–444 BCE), were confiscated by the Iraqi Antiquities authority and handed over to the Iraq Museum in Baghdad (“IM group B”).³ Since the IM group B and the Jerusalem group came to our attention only when this manuscript was nearing completion, they will be dealt with in a separate volume, together with an in-depth study of the entire corpus. The following remarks are therefore not meant to be exhaustive but intended as a preliminary summary.




Fig. 1: Preliminary stemma of the family of Šamaš-zēru-ibni, son of Ayya-na'ad

The 67 texts of the IM group A as well as many, if not all of the other sub-groups belong to the family archive of Šamaš-zēru-ibni, son of Ayya-na²ad, and his descendants who, judging by some of their names, were of West Semitic extraction (fig. 1).⁴ By the conventional standards of attribution, that is, connections of prosopography, form, function and contents, at least 105⁵ illicitly excavated pieces, possibly sourced from a single findspot (but see below), are the available sample from an original deposit of an unknown number of component texts. The fact that the texts have been so widely dispersed over so long a period, and the unknown archaeological situation of the excavated portion of the archive leave open the possibility that two or more archives, reflecting the activities of different

generations and business partners,⁶ were actually conflated and redeposited in antiquity. Against this supposition stands the fact that the Louvre group is a relatively homogenous group in terms of contents in that it only records the activities of Šamaš-zēru-ibni's sons and includes several property documents; and that the (known) texts in which Šamaš-zēru-ibni figures as contracting party (those of the IM group A and the VAM group) are by and large promissory notes and other short-lived documents which had little to no value for later generations.⁷

As a corollary of the group's composition (IM group A), next to nothing is known about Šamaš-zēru-ibni's family history. His three brothers, placed in the stemma on grounds of sharing the same rare patronym,⁹ only appear in bare mentions as witnesses;¹⁰ and his spouse as well as his son (II)tameš-kīn are only known because they each occur once as creditors. His remaining two sons recur repeatedly in the Louvre group, and at least one of them, Akī-Milki-ilū'a, also appears in the

IM group A.¹¹ But apart from business activities, the pertinent texts are silent on their affairs.

1.2. Onomastics

A perusal of the prosopography¹² shows that many individuals bore non-Babylonian, that is, mostly West Semitic names, albeit common Babylonian names outweigh these by far; and that there are no family or ancestor names present.¹³ Given the supposed origin of the archive,¹⁴ this comes as no surprise. Like the Murašû archive, it reflects the socioeconomic milieu in the hinterland of the larger Babylonian cities, defined by the concerns of a small population of active, mobile businessmen, who had no or next to no direct ties to the old and prestigious clans of the Babylonian urban elite. Even if these men bore Babylonian names, it is an obvious guess that many of them were also of West Semitic extraction, masked by the effects of acculturation. The family of the archive-holding Šamaš-zēru-ibni is a case in point.

Among the non-Babylonian names, the most noteworthy is the name of Šamaš-zēru-ibni's father Ayya-na²ad, as it underscores the presumed ethnicity of the family. It is of West Semitic, possibly Old South Arabian origin, consisting of the theophoric element Ayya and the predicative element *na²ad(a)*, which is formed on the root √ N-?-D “to praise.”¹⁵ In addition to Ayya, several other West Semitic theophoric elements occur in the archive. The following table illustrates the distribution of these and other theophoric elements within the archive.¹⁶

4. Prosopography

The prosopography contains 305 entries (person files) collected from the Šāter texts presented in this volume and those published elsewhere, excluding those in Abraham & Zilberg 2024.⁸⁹ Personal names, patronyms and family or ancestor names are cited in this form: PN₁/PN₂//PN₃, where the virgule (/) separates the name from the patronym and the double virgule (//) separates the name or patronym from the family or ancestor name. Bold line numbers indicate that the text mentions both the personal name and patronym. If put in square brackets, they refer to names that are (partially) restored (including patronyms). Uncertain readings of names and name elements are in italics. Non-Babylonian or hybrid names have the sign “+” added. Note furthermore the following abbreviations: b. = brother of; ep = (Aramaic) epigraph; f. = father of; fn = fingernail impression (captioned); s. = seal (captioned); s. = spouse of; sl. = slave of.
