

□ **pioneer:** a person who is among the first to explore or develop something new

- Marie Curie was a pioneer in the field of radioactivity.
- The Wright brothers pioneered the first successful airplane flight.

□ **subsequently:** afterward; later on

- He graduated from college and subsequently moved to New York.
- The company was founded in 1990 and subsequently expanded internationally.

□ **virtually:** almost; nearly

- The stadium was virtually empty after the game ended.
- She is virtually fluent in Spanish.

□ **exhibit:** to show or display something publicly

- The museum will exhibit ancient artifacts from Egypt.
- He began to exhibit signs of stress after the long work hours.

□ **elusive:** difficult to find, catch, or understand

- The solution to the puzzle remained elusive.
- The elusive criminal evaded capture for years.

□ **alter:** to change or modify something

- She had to alter her dress for the wedding.
- The plan was altered due to unforeseen circumstances.

□ **conviction:** a strong belief or opinion

- He spoke with conviction about the need for reform.
- Her conviction in her abilities led to her success.

□ **go viral:** to become very popular very quickly on the internet

- The video of the cat playing piano went viral overnight.
- Her tweet about the event went viral and was shared thousands of times.

□ **conceive:** to form or devise an idea or plan

- He conceived the idea for the project during his vacation.
- The architect conceived a new design for the building.
