

- **Innate (adj):** natural, existing from birth.
 - She has an **innate** sense of rhythm.
 - Kindness is **innate** in some people.

- **Minor (adj/noun):** small, less important / person under 18.
 - It's a **minor** problem, don't worry.
 - He's still a **minor** and can't vote.

- **Thus (adv):** as a result, in this way.
 - It was raining, **thus** we stayed inside.
 - He worked hard, **thus** succeeded.

- **Enhance (verb):** improve, make better.
 - This app will **enhance** your photos.
 - A little salt can **enhance** the flavor.

- **Purely (adv):** only, entirely.
 - The decision was **purely** personal.
 - She called **purely** to check on you.

- **Per se (adv):** by itself, in itself.
 - It's not illegal **per se**, but risky.
 - Money **per se** doesn't bring happiness.

- **Drive (noun/verb):** strong desire / push to do.
 - She has a strong **drive** to learn.
 - His words **drove** me to try harder.

- **Pointless (adj):** having no purpose.
 - This argument is **pointless**.
 - A **pointless** task wastes time.
- **Extensive (adj):** large, widespread.
 - The storm caused **extensive** damage.
 - He has **extensive** experience in teaching.
- **Inanimate (adj):** not alive.
 - A rock is an **inanimate** object.
 - The room was full of **inanimate** statues.
- **A bunch of (phrase):** a group of things or people.
 - She bought **a bunch of** flowers.
 - I have **a bunch of** emails to answer.
- **In captivity (phrase):** kept confined, not free.
 - Lions don't thrive **in captivity**.
 - The zoo keeps rare birds **in captivity**.
