

Use these plans to build yourself a simple and sturdy utility cart for your garage or shop.

Simple Utility Cart



Introduction:

Make sure to read through this build guide **BEFORE** cutting any wood. Familiarize yourself with the tools, techniques, and your approach to building this project.

Make adjustments if needed before doing any cutting or building.

I recommend pre-drilling every screw hole before driving in the screws to prevent board cracking.

Tools, Supplies, and Lumber Needed:

<u>Tools:</u>

- Drill
- Circular Saw or Miter Saw
- Table Saw (*Optional*)
- Drill Bits
- Tape Measure
- Speed Square (For Marking Cuts / Optional)
- Pencil


Supplies:

- 2 ¹/₂" Wood Screws
- 1¹/₄" Wood Screws
- Wood Glue (*Optional*)
- (4) 3" Casters (All Swivel OR 2 Swivel / 2 Fixed)

Lumber:


- (4) 2x4x8's
- (1) ½" 4x8 Plywood Sheet OR (2) ½" 2x4 Plywood Sheets

Cutlist (cont.):

If using two 2x4 sheets of ply...cut one 20" x 33" piece from EACH sheet






Tray Assembly:

Build a frame with **two 33"** and **two 17"** pieces.

Pre-drill and screw *two* 2 ½" screws in each

end.







Repeat this step again for second tray

Leg Assembly:


Flip tray over and start attaching each **27**" leg with *two* **2** ½" screws



Flip **second** tray ply side up and flip tray w/legs over **lining up legs to second tray**



Casters:
