

What is the passive voice?

The passive voice is used when the subject of a sentence receives an action.





← The cyclist rode the bike.

(ACTIVE)

The bike was ridden by the cyclist. (PASSIVE)



Why do we need it?

The passive is used when the focus is on the person or thing that receives an action.

A man is teaching a boy to ride a bike. (ACTIVE)

The boy is being taught to ride a bike. (PASSIVE)

When is it used?

The passive voice is commonly used with the following verbs and topics:

INVENTIONS & DISCOVERIES



be discovered be invented be tested

PRODUCTION & INDUSTRY



be produced be grown be made

ARTS & ENTERTAINMENT



be directed be written be filmed

CRIME & PUNISHMENT



be caught be stolen be punished

EMERGENCIES & DISASTERS




be destroyed be hurt be broken

How The Passive Is Formed

- The subject moves to the object position.
- The object moves to the subject position.
- 3 Split the verb into a BE verb + past participle.
- 4 Add BY to show who performed the action.

Sub + Be + V3 + Obj



The Passive BE Verb

The BE verb changes depending on the subject and tense of the sentence.



	PAST	PRESENT	FUTURE
SIMPLE	was / were	am / is / are	will be
CONTINUOUS	was / were being	am / is / are being	am / is / are going to be
PERFECT	had been	has / have been	will have been


